0. Objective

The purpose of this document is to give the definition of a manufacturer who is entitled to apply for a notification of test results within the CCA procedures (normal and SMT, WMT & TMP procedures).

1. Definitions

Manufacturer

A company with manufacturing capacity, situated at a stated location or stated locations, that carries out or controls stages in the manufacture, such as: the assessment, handling and storage of a product and accepts responsibility for continued compliance of the product with the relevant requirements and undertakes all obligations in that connection.

Factory

The location at which the product is produced or assembled and a follow-up service is established by the CB.

Manufacturer's Testing Laboratory

A manufacturer's testing laboratory, being used by a CB to conduct testing within categories of products for which the manufacturer has design and production responsibility, using one of the Manufacturers' Testing Laboratory procedures as defined in OD CIG 033 "General Principles for Manufacturers' Test Laboratories".

2. Manufacturer entitled to apply

A company (referred to as applicant) may apply for a Notification of Test Results (NTR) if it is a manufacturer as defined under Article 1. There is no geographical restriction on where the Manufacturer can be located.

3. Certification Body Responsibilities for Manufacturers' Testing Laboratories

When the testing has been carried out at a Manufacturer's Testing Laboratory, the application must be managed by the Supervising Certification Body (Body A) that is a member of the CCA. The status of the laboratory and the Manufacturer's Testing Laboratory procedure used must be clearly defined in the application and a reference included under "Additional information" in the NTR.

It is the responsibility of the Supervising Certification Body to satisfy itself that all the Scheme conditions are met.
